Dear Sisters, Associates, Co-Workers, Family and Friends,

"Praised be you, my Lord, through our Sister Bodily Death..."

[The Canticle of the Creatures, FAED1, 113-114]

At 4:30 a.m. on the second day of Lent, Sister Jonette Scheidler began her praise of God through our Sister Bodily Death. At 97 years of age, S. Jonette had lived a long and faithful life in the service and love of the God of all Creation.

S. Jonette (Mary Josephine) was born to Clara and Paul Scheidler, the third of their seven children. Her schooling was through St. Mary's in Millhousen, Immaculate Conception Academy, Greensburg High School and later in her Community life at Marian College (now Marian University) and Ball State. She often recounted the story of the local, then regional spelling bee, which allowed her and her dad to spend a week in Washington D.C., where she competed on the national level and placed third. She then coached her brother Anthony who also won the trip to Washington D. C. with their mother.

For ten years following high school graduation, S. Jonette worked for Dr. J. Wm. Herr, for the Coca-Cola Bottling Company, the state license bureau, and McCoy-Douglas, Inc. She bought a car and felt that she was free and independent, but also felt that there was something missing. She then applied to the Dominican Sisters in Nashville, Tennessee, but halted that process when her mother said that with four sons in the Army and at war, she couldn't bear for Mary Josephine to leave, too. After the war, she decided to stay closer to home and entered the Sisters of St. Francis at Oldenburg.

Being born into a farm family, S. Jonette continued to enjoy the gifts of creation, especially gardening, fishing and animals, particularly cats. She enjoyed her fifty-seven years of teaching, specializing in 5th and 6th grades. She also spent six years in family ministry, caring for her brother and sister-in-law. In all of these ministries and hobbies, S. Jonette found the fulfillment for which she had searched prior to entering religious life.
