The Carmen de Barros Scholarship is usually awarded to four Latino students each spring who will be attending a Catholic high school in the coming school year. This scholarship is named in honor of Sr. Carmen de Barros who was born in Cuba and came to Marian College (now University) in Indianapolis as a student in the 1940s. For several years she was in ministry in Chicago at a House of Discernment for Hispanic women. She and other Sisters of St. Francis of Oldenburg, Indiana have been in ministry with Hispanics in parishes, migrant camps, and in El Paso and Los Angeles. In the past we were mostly in educational ministries; now one way that we continue these ministries is through this scholarship. It's an annual \$1000 scholarship renewable for each year of high school depending on the continued financial need and satisfactory academic performance.
